

The Pannill Award of The American Daffodil Society April 2008

The William G. Pannill Award is given annually to an American hybridizer to recognize a named standard daffodil which has demonstrated winning show qualities. This award was first presented in 1997. The criteria is as follows:

1. Demonstrated winning show qualities for a minimum of 5 years following registration.
2. Must have been awarded at least one ADS Gold or White Ribbon within the last 5 years.
3. Must be regarded as generally "growable and showable" in a majority of the ADS regions.

The following daffodils have received the Pannill Award:

1. **'Gull'**, 2 W-GWW, an all white large-cupped daffodil bred by Grant Mitsch, 1997 (Sources: 3)
2. **'Homestead'**, 2 W-W, an all white large-cupped daffodil bred by William Pannill, 1998 (Sources: 7, 11)
3. **'Rapture'**, 6 Y-Y, an all yellow cyclamineus hybrid daffodil, bred by Grant Mitsch, 1999 (Sources: 2, 4, 5, 7, 10, 11, 12, 13)
4. **'Pacific Rim'**, 2 Y-YYR, a yellow large-cupped daffodil with red rim, bred by Grant Mitsch, 2000 (Sources: 5, 7, 11, 13)
5. **'Geometrics'**, 2 W-Y, a white and yellow large-cupped daffodil, bred by Sidney DuBose, 2001 (Sources: 3, 6, 9)
6. **'Conestoga'**, 2 W-GYO, a large-cupped daffodil with white perianth and a green-eyed yellow cup rimmed in orange, bred by William Bender, 2002 (Sources: 5, 7, 9)
7. **'River Queen'**, 2 W-W, a large-cupped daffodil with white perianth and a white cup, bred by William Pannill, 2003. (Sources: 4, 7, 9, 13)
8. **'POPS Legacy'**, 1 W-Y, an early season white and yellow trumpet daffodil bred by William Bender, 2004. (Sources: 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 13)
9. **'LaPaloma'**, 3 W-GYR, a midseason flower with a white perianth and a small yellow cup with a green eye and a red rim, bred by William Roesse, 2005. (Sources: 6, 9)

10. ‘**New Penny**’, 3 Y-Y, a small-cupped daffodil with yellow perianth and yellow cup, bred by William Pannill, 2006. (Sources: 3, 4, 6, 12)
11. ‘**Pink China**’, 2 W-P, an intermediate-sized pink and white large cup daffodil bred by Richard and Elise Havens, 2007. (Sources: 5)
12. ‘**Pink Silk**’, 1 W-P, an early-midseason trumpet daffodil with a pink cup, bred by Richard and Elise Havens, 2008. (Sources: 2, 4, 12, 13)
